## **Al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula Claims Credit for the Killing of 130 Yemeni Security Forces in Zinjibar (September 30, 2011)**

*On September 30, 2011, Al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula released a communication claiming credit for the killing of 130 Yemeni security forces in Zinjibar. The communiqué also reported on “the most important military operations in Abyan province.”*

“Praise Allah Lord of the Worlds and prayer and peace upon the most honorable of the prophets and messengers, and thereafter:”

“With the grace of Allah, the Mujahideen were able to ambush the political security forces in the area surrounding the political security building in Zinjibar. 130 from the political security forces were killed, and an unknown number of others were injured. That was on Wednesday, September 14, 2011.”

“And in the province of Aden, an explosive device detonated in the political security building, and another explosive device detonated at the intelligence building, and an explosive device at the general security building. That was on Monday, September 12, 2011.”

“And following is a news report about the most important military operations in Abyan province from the date of the arrival of Ali Saleh’s government back to the Mica Brigade 25:”

1. “On Sunday, September 11, 2011, two soldiers were killed surrounding the Mica Brigade 25 in Zinjibar.”
2. “On Sunday, September 11, 2011, a number of soldiers were killed and others injured after raiding the building where they were fortified in al-Kod region.”
3. “And on Monday, September 12, 2011, on the edges of Zinjibar city, the Mujahideen ambushed a military crew that led to the death of ten and injured others from the Yemeni Army forces, and destruction of an armored vehicle. And in this operation, brother Abd Rabbo al-Awlaqi was killed, may Allah have mercy on him.”

“And praise Allah Lord of the Worlds.”
